Smoking is not allowed within the clubhouse but is permissible on the balcony and patio area.

General Information

- The Rules of Golf and Golfing Etiquette apply at all times
- Society tees are yellow for men and red for ladies
- Handicaps for all players are required
- Texas Scramble formats are not permitted
- Dress Code is enclosed on pages 6 & 7. Please ensure that all players are aware of the club dress rules to avoid any embarrassment.
- Please contact the Pro Shop on arrival to settle green fees and to obtain the clubhouse entry codes. Please ask at the bar for the exit barrier codes before you leave.
- It is the responsibility of every player to ensure that they have sufficient insurance cover to meet their all needs whilst on the Club premises. This will include personal accident or injury to themselves or others and third party damage. All golfers are responsible for their personal belongings whilst on club premises
- The use of mobile phones is restricted to the car park area.
- Please contact the caterer during the day with regard to meal times.

Car Park Security Barriers

As you approach the entrance barrier it will rise to allow access. Please wait until it is fully raised before entering.

Before you leave please obtain the daily barrier code from the bar, pro shop or kitchen then enter this code to activate the exit barrier. Do not try to pass through the barrier while it is moving.

How to find us

From the M5 leave at junction 5 and take the A38 towards Droitwich/Worcester. You will pass the Robin Hood Pub on your left, then the Little Chef on your right and after a further 300 yards turn right at the bottom of the hill into Ford Lane, signposted to Elmbridge.

From Droitwich take the A38 towards Bromsgrove and after you pass The Chateau Impney Hotel on your right take the first left into Ford Lane, signposted to Elmbridge.

DRESS RULES ON THE COURSE

GENTLEMEN

Conventional approved golfing attire to include:

Polo and turtle neck tops.

Shirts must have collars and sleeves and be tucked into trousers.

Tailored shorts no higher than 4" above the knee but not below the knee and to be worn with plain knee length socks turned over at the top or predominantly white short sports socks.

Recognised golfing footwear and headwear.

LADIES

Conventional approved golfing attire to include:

Shirts with collars and sleeves.

Sleeveless shirts with collars.

Cropped trousers

Skirts/shorts no higher than 4" above the knee

Ankle or short socks

Recognised golfing footwear and headwear.

UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE ON THE COURSE

Trousers/shorts with side patch pockets(cargo style)

Denim jeans, collarless and crew neck shirts

Football /Rugby shirts

Beach style, football or rugby shorts and socks

Sun tops

Trainer socks(gentlemen)

Trainers,track suits, trousers tucked into socks (unless worn under waterproofs)

Baseball style caps worn the wrong way round

DRESS RULES IN THE CLUBHOUSE

Smart casual clothes may be worn in all areas of the clubhouse including the dining room.

Approved tailored shorts(see definition) may be worn in the lounge up to 7.00pm. Appropriate style shoes(not trainers or beach wear) must be worn.

Shirts which are so designed may be worn outside trousers by gentlemen in the clubhouse (this does not mean that gentlemen coming off the course can untuck a golf shirt)

The wearing of shorts in the dining room is prohibited at all times

The following are not permitted in the clubhouse

Waterproofs and leisure tops are not permitted in the main lounge/bar and must be removed before entering.

Cargo trousers, denim jeans, shirts without collars, rugby/football shirts, track suits, trainers and beach style flip flops.

Hats of any type.

Golf shoes may not be worn in the clubhouse except to and from the changing rooms and in the spike bar.

Golf shoes may not be worn on the balcony or the stairs leading to the balcony. It is expected that golfers will change from their golfing attire if using the dining room.

Definition

Tailored shorts no more than 4" above the knee, no longer than knee length and with conventional pockets(not cargo style or large patch pockets)

Shirts without collars(ie crew), tee shirts and running type vests are not permissible. Roll and turtle neck are permissible.

Smart casual- generally a jacket and tie are not required. However shirts must have a regular collar and trousers as permitted on the course.
